A History of Partners In Development

1990 – Partners In Development, Inc. (PID) was founded as a 501(c)(3) nonprofit Christian organization to serve the extreme poor. The program began by sponsoring ten children in Haiti so they could attend school before it was incorporated in 1987.

1990 - First ten small business loans offered in Haiti to adults who could not qualify for a bank loan.

2000 – Construction began on the first house built by PID in Haiti. Construction was completed in March 2001.

2000 - First mission trip to Haiti

2003 - Gale Hull named an honorary Rotarian for her efforts in the developing world

2004 - PID breaks ground to build its medical clinic in Haiti

2004 – PID joins forces with a neighborhood group in Blanchard, Haiti to bring clean drinking water to the area by drilling a 125 foot deep well

2005 - PID expands to Village Concepcion, Guatemala

2006 - First house built by Partners In Development in Guatemala

2006 - PID opens a medical clinic in Guatemala

2006 - PID expands to offer a dozen mission trips a year to both Haiti and Guatemala

2007 - School in Guatemala renames the facility the Gale V. Hull Escuela in honor of PID's President and in gratitude of PID's work there

2008 - Gale Hull awarded honorary Doctorate of Humane Letters from St. Joseph's College in Standish, Maine

2009 - PID kicks off a clean water project in Guatemala
