History and Mission

Partners In Development, Inc. (PID) strives to help the extreme poor attain independence and whole life improvement. PID was founded in 1990 by Gale and James Hull in Port-au-Prince, Haiti. In 2004, we began construction of our first medical clinic. The clinic provided primary care for 6,000 patients a year. In 2005, we expanded our program to Guatemala. PID combines a variety of programs to achieve transformation in places where hope is often lost in the cycle of poverty.

Medical Care in Haiti & Guatemala

80% – Haitian citizens live below poverty line

PID's Medical Clinics

Our clinics follow protocols recommended by the World Health Organization and, in Haiti, the Department of Public Health. We also have our own medical protocol in order to ensure continuity of care.

- 30,000+ total patients treated annually
- Full-time and part-time staff members, including physicians, pharmacists, nurses, lab technicians, security officers, interpreters for U.S. teams, support staff and social workers
